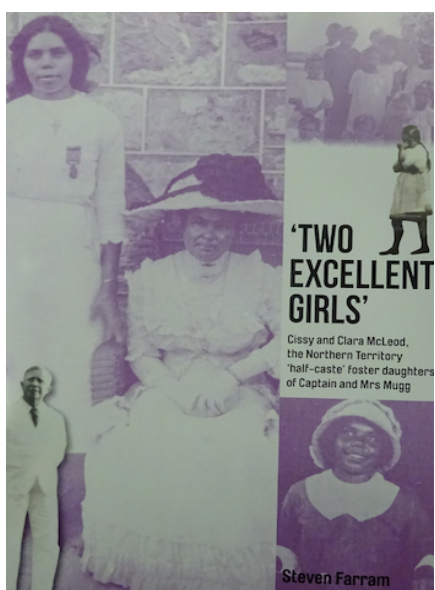

From Agar plate to Casuarina Beach

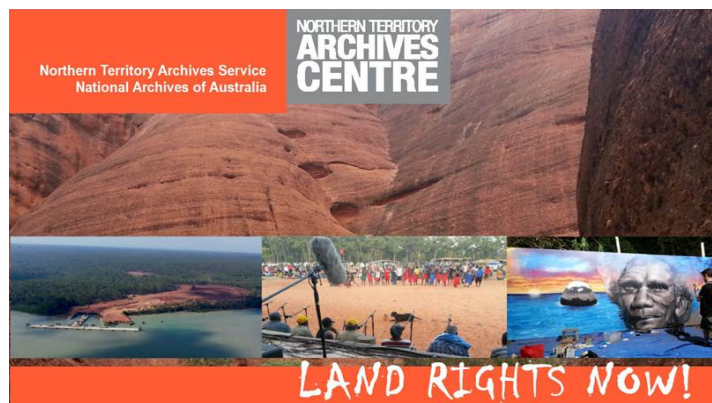

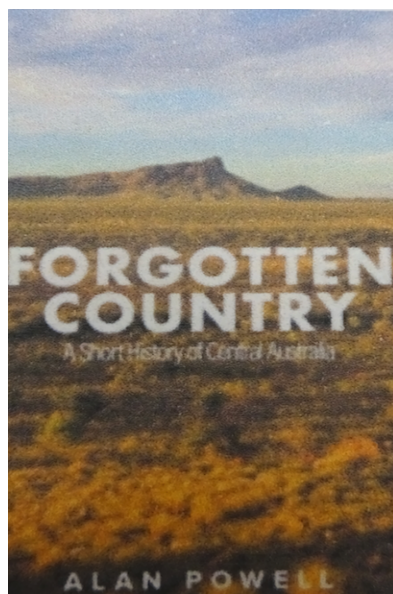
